Need an attorney but can't afford one? Trying to muddle through the legal maze yourself? Pay a visit to the Kane County Law Library & Self Help Legal Center to see if you qualify for a “Lawyer in the Library”



The Kane County Law Library & Self Help Legal Center in partnership with Administer Justice and the Kane County Bar Association have created a program to assist qualifying low income individuals with their ***Kane County*** legal needs. Attorneys volunteer their time to provide legal coaching, document review, and referrals for qualifying individuals.

To see if you meet the specific criteria for assistance, ***you must visit the Kane County Law Library & Self Help Legal Center in person.*** You may stop by to see if you qualify any time the law library is open. If you meet the criteria, you will be required to sign a “Certification of Finances” statement and leave a \$10 cash deposit. ***You will then be scheduled to meet with an attorney at a later date.*** When you meet with the attorney your \$10 will be refunded.
